

GREEN FUSE POETS' STUDIO

WORKSHOPS, CHAPBOOKS, READINGS

This summer Green Fuse will continue its new Poets' Studio workshops to be held at the **Daz Bog café conference room in downtown Loveland**, since the Loveland Library meeting room (our scheduled home) will be closed due to construction until 2011. The workshops will be offered thrice yearly, one in the spring, one in the summer, and one in the fall. The first will have to do with poetic technique, the second with **chapbook-making**, and the third with reading and presentation techniques. There will be a public reading for participants at the end of the fall workshop and ***one individual chapbook will be published annually as part of a Green Fuse Poets' Studio Series.*** These workshops are open to the public. They are fully sponsored by Green Fuse, a non-profit endeavor; donations of ten dollars a class to support the Poets' Studio are welcome and much appreciated and will underwrite the publication of the chapbooks. The workshops will be taught by Green Fuse members and visiting poets and experts in their fields (such as a Ft. The workshop on chapbook making will be held on three Saturdays and one Sunday of June. The Saturday workshops will run from 11-1 on the first, third, and last Saturday of June. "My Chapbook" concerns choosing the right poems and sequence of poems for a short collection, picking works that overlap in theme, image, or technique and weaving them together in a compelling, almost story-like manner. The workshop consists of four two-hour seminars which culminate in a preliminary chapbook collection, the polished version of which may be submitted to Green Fuse for publication.
